The Key Tasks and Responsibilities of the role are to:

YOUNG PEOPLE

KT 1	Work with Programme Leads to deliver safe and supportive provision
KT 2	Assist Programme Leads in the design and delivery of meaningful youth provision
KT 3	Enhance participant experience by helping to create an environment of acceptance and social belonging
KT 4	Provide appropriate and supportive leadership and mentoring to young people attending TSP youth provision
KT 5	Acting as a role model for young people, championing their rights, and talents, and interests

THE SUNNYWOOD PROJECT

KT 5	Model the ethos of TSP, promote the work of the organisation, and celebrate participant and community achievements as often as possible
KT 6	Engage with training as required for the role and follow TSP Policies and Procedures at all times

GENERAL

KT 7	Assist with the signposting of young people to other provisions, were appropriate
KT 8	Assisting Programme Leads with the recruitment of participants and with communications with parents/guardians and external organisations about upcoming sessions

Other Considerations

As part of the Induction Process, you'll be required to undergo an Enhanced DBS check or have equivalent evidence (e.g. update service and original certificate)

Most youth provision is delivered on evenings and at weekends, or during the school holidays

All volunteers will have access to TSP events and services, including training, in return for the contribution of their time
