TOWN OF CULTURE

1. Start your journey outside the Lamppost Café. The first Burrs Country Park History Trail sign is located on the notice board to the right side of the café.

2. From the café, head across the road towards the tall chimney. The 2nd Burrs Country Park History Trail sign is located on a raised wooden planter.

3. Head towards the car park adjacent to the chimney and continue towards the steps / ramp.

At the top of the steps / ramp, you will face the canal feeder; turn left at the top of steps / ramp and walk 50m until you reach the aqueduct.

The 3rd Burrs Country Park History Trail sign is located on a wooden post just before the aqueduct.

4. Return and walk back along the path heading towards to the ramp / steps. Continue along the path as it crosses over a green, metal footbridge.

You will be met by a sculpture made from triangular stones.

The 4th Burrs Country Park History Trail sign is located on the side of a wooden bin unit.

5. Continue along the path, keeping the canal feeder on your right for approximately 500m.

The 5th Burrs Country Park History Trail sign is located on a wooden fence opposite the weir.

6. Follow the path, making a hair pin turn over the start of the canal feeder and continue along the trail with the canal feeder on your right and a steep hillside on your left for approximately 50m.

The 6th Burrs Country Park History Trail sign is located on a wooden fence.

7. Continue ascending the trail path which will bring you on to the Burrs Country Park show ground. Follow the path with the caravan site on your left until you reach the gate at the far end of the show ground.

Go through the gate, cross the road and head towards the Brown Cow pub.

The 7th Burrs Country Park History Trail sign is located on a fence post opposite the entrance to the Brown Cow pub.

8. Continue along the path with The Brown Cow pub on your left for approximately 40m.

The 8th Burrs Country Park History Trail sign is located on a wooden sign post below the 'To The Trains' sign.

9. Turn around and take the path that descends towards the cottages / Lamppost Café. Keeping to the pavement, go past the end of the row of cottages (the left side) and cross over a small metal footbridge with blue railings.

Follow the trail towards the road; the river on the left and the rear of the lamppost café of your right. When you reach the road, turn left and walk along the bridge.

The 9th Burrs Country Park History Trail sign is located on a wooden fence at the end of the bridge.

10. At the end of the bridge, turn left and walk for approximately 80m until you reach a junction.

Turn right and take the trail path that runs adjacent to the right of the fishing ponds. Continue along this path, passing the fishing ponds on your right for approximately 150m.

The path will ascend into a paved courtyard area.

The 10th Burrs Country Park History Trail sign is located on the side of a raised wooden planter.
